

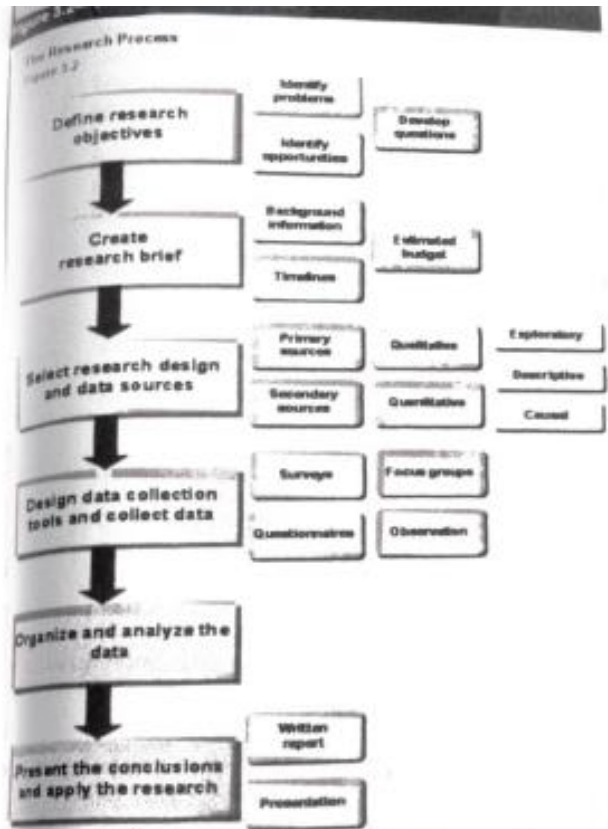

COMPOSITION

If students are intimidated by the prospect of doing a research paper, this audiocassette will only serve to heighten that fear. Early on the listener is told that "since there are serious penalties for thievery, either intentional or otherwise, there are needs for precautions against plagiarism." This tape never offers a positive reason for proper documentation. The fear of severe penalty is the motivating spirit that informs some of the commonsense advice on how and when to paraphrase and how to use quotation marks. The simulated dialogue between student and teacher on the topic of avoiding plagiarism just doesn't ring true. Not recommended.—

# *Game On!*

## **Key Rule:**

**In a single turn, the player may only come in contact with one card.** Even if the card allows a player to advance to another square that directs them to pick up another card, the turn **ends before** the card is drawn. On the player's next turn, **they begin by rolling the dice.**
